


Safer Internet Day 2024





We are having intermittent issues with our telephone lines so please do email where possible.
- <u>Suitable clothing for weather conditions</u>: Due to the particularly cold and
 wet weather can we please ask that all pupils come to school with weather
 appropriate clothing. Please ensure all items are named to make sure they are
 returned if lost.
- Water Bottles: All pupils should have a named water bottle in school every

 for your child please contact the school office for assistance.

If we are not notified of an absence the school office is required to contact you directly.
- Sports Club Attendance: If your child is not attending their after-school sports club on a particular day please notify the school office. Parents will be contacted if a child has not attended a club they are booked onto to acertain the childs whereabouts and safety.


