Wraparound care

At SHJS we understand the importance of providing our parents with wraparound care options. Our chosen care provider is The Alresford Youth Association (The AYA). They offer an on-site Breakfast and After School Club in a dedicated space located at Sun Hill Junior School. They cater for both Junior and Infant School pupils. Breakfast club starts at 7.30am and After School Club provides care until 6pm.

After School Club comes with the option of a hot or cold meal from a nutritious and varied rotating menu. Students are welcome to complete homework, participate in outdoor play and games and engage with hobbies and crafts in a safe, fully staffed environment.

Lunches

At lunchtime, staff and students eat lunch together in our hall. Our School lunches are supplied by catering provider HC3S.

"At HC3S, our ethos is about tasty food to help children flourish. And to do that it helps if they eat a healthy diet. By providing nutritious food, cooked fresh every day and which is responsibly sourced, we give children a balanced diet with choices that aid concentration levels and gives them energy to focus and to play." Menu's are changed twice a year (Easter to October halfterm & October half-term to Easter) and meals are charged at £2.50 per day. This includes a main meal along with additional bread and salad which is available daily. A selection of alternative desserts (bananas, apples, oranges, yoghurts, rice pots, fruit pots, cheeses, fruit juices and low-sugar desserts) are also available each day. If you feel your child may be entitled to a free school meal then please contact the school office.

Alternatively, children are welcome to bring a packed lunch. These should be clearly labelled with your child's name and class. We politely ask that no nuts are included in any lunchbox items as we have number of pupils in school with allergies. We encourage healthy eating in school and have a policy of no sweets, crisps or chocolate bars for morning break.

Uniform

At Sun Hill Junior School we believe that wearing a school uniform evokes a feeling of pride in the school and the individual. It also helps children to have a strong sense of identity and feel part of the school community, however it is not compulsory to wear our logo as long as the school colours and style is adhered to.



A day in the Life of a **student**

By two year 6 students.

"When you join Sun Hill Juniors in year 3, you will be in Ladybird or Dragonfly class. Whichever teacher you have, in whatever class you are in, all the staff are kind, supportive and all-round stars.

A normal day begins with putting your bag on either a peg (lower school) or in a locker (upper school), if you have a packed lunch you put it on a trolley or order your delicious hot meal on the laptop from the 3 options. When you get into class, you are set an Early Morning Activity to complete whether it's editing, mental arithmetic or simply reading. Your first lesson will be either Maths or English. Break is a good time to catch up with friends and relax. After break, you will have an hour of lessons until its lunchtime.

At Sun Hill we have two amazing playgrounds, a MUGA for sport, a clamber stack and a field, it's great having so much outdoor space. During lunch time we have a wide variety of activities to keep us busy, we are lucky to have two ping pong tables, giant connect 4 sets and lots of sports equipment! After lunch you have a few more lessons including topic, your class language and every day we run a 'daily mile."

On Fridays we have a celebration assembly in which there are certificates for children who have followed our STARS reward scheme. STARS stands for Strive, Trust, Aspire, **Resilience** and **Support**. There are other awards for knowing vour times tables and Music certificates for when you achieve twenty merits. Also we have the Clean Sweep Award for the tidiest area of the school! It's really fun!

Throughout your Sun Hill journey, you will have plenty of opportunities to apply for different roles whether it's the school council. running your own clubs, being a sports leader or being house captain. We also have a sports day in the Summer on our field and we can take part in lots of Creative Arts activities, there is always so much going on at school whatever you are interested in.
